## Regional Pandemic Preparedness Project (RPPP)

### The Project:

The second phase of the Regional Pandemic Preparedness Project (RPPP) advising ECOWAS and Member States Institutions on the implementation of core capacities of the International Health Regulations has begun. In the new project there will be an increased focus on support to One Health actors at all levels of the system, on building exchange formats, communications and coordination between them and on building human and technical capacity in this sector. Cooperation will be based on enhancement and further development of key products and deliverables of RPPP1, such as the regional risk communications strategy, the ECOWAS Regional Rapid Response Team (ERRRT) digital communications platforms The project will also support the development of the Regional One Health platform of ECOWAS and of selected Member States. It will also support SORMAS implementation at Member State and Regional level.

## A. Responsibilities

The Embedded Technical Adviser – Epidemiology and Digital Surveillance – will be located within the Regional Centre for Surveillance and Disease Control (RCSDC), a specialized agency under the supervision of the West African Health Organization (WAHO).

The role will support the overall conceptualization, planning and implementation of activities designed to in building the internal and external capacity of the RCSDC to deliver its mandate to support ECOWAS Member States in epidemiology, disease surveillance and implementation of digital solutions (including SORMAS), with an emphasis on pandemic prone diseases in a One Health context.

## Responsibilities & tasks:

#### B. Tasks

Under the supervision of the Executive Director of RCSDC, the Advisor will undertake the following roles and functions:

- Both provide strategic and technical advice to RCSDC and support to activities related to the development of a regional approach to disease epidemiology, surveillance and implementation of IDSR, with a particular focus on the implementation of digital surveillance tools, such as SORMAS.
- Support to activities identified in the RPPP Operational Plan, which refer to digital approaches to epidemiological surveillance/early warning, facilitating their integration in the working plan of the RCSDC and substantially contributing to their implementation and to the achievement of their intended results.
- Support the fostering of dynamic partnerships with key stakeholders at the regional and national levels, including other WAHO Directorates, other parts of the ECOWAS Commission,





Member States' National Coordinating Institutions civil society, media, and other development partners.

- Provide context analysis and technical briefs and research, develop, and deliver presentations, prepare various forms of documentation (e.g., background papers, knowledge products and others) as may be required.
- Ensure visibility for the joint activities which support the development of RSCDC and the network of NCIs.
- Contribute to the knowledge management processes of the project.
- Support operational planning and provide administrative and logistical support for the delivery of GIZ RPPP support to RCSDC.
- Perform other project-related duties and functions as may be directed by the line supervisor;
